













September 11-15/2017

During 15 – 11 September 2017, Y PEER Libya implemented Training of trainers (TOT) about Gender based violence, sexual and reproductive health and Rights, HIV and acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS). 19 young people (5 females, 14 males) participated in the training from 10 municipalities from Libya, from the South, East and West. The training was held in Carthage Thalasso Resort -Tunis with the support of the United Nations Population Fund - Libya (UNFPA). After the training, the new trainers conducted 8 basic training each in his municipality in Libya in cooperation with governmental and non-governmental organizations where more than 160 peer educators were trained In addition to implementing different innovative activities related to the same themes reaching more than 4000 young people with awareness and information



December 15th 2017

Y PEER Libya organized a closing ceremony for the -10day of activism campaign under the theme "Youth engagement" as well as the -16day awareness on Gender based violence campaign. The ceremony was held in Tripoli Libya in (Bashir Al - Saadawi Forum), with the presence of a large number of Actors in public affairs in Libya, including the Administrator of Culture Authority, representative of the National Center for Disease Control and the participation of many peer educators and trainers in the network as well as a large number of young people working in the field of awareness and youth empowerment a number of pictures and videos from various activities conducted during the two campaigns were presented in the ceremony.

The diversity of these activities became clear to the audience. More than 65 activities were held in more than 12 Municipality, among these activities:

- 1- Using graffiti art in Libyan street to highlight the issues related to violence.
- 2- awareness workshops and TV/ Radio.
- 3- Interactive theater shows for young people.
- 4- Various outreach sessions for youth.





The aim of these activities was to raise awareness about issues of violence; especially Gender based violence, HIV awareness, acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS), Youth engagement and participation.

During the ceremony, speeches were made by partners and supporters, including the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) in Libya and the founders of the Y PPER in Libya (the network was established in Libya in 2010) and representatives of the National Center for Disease Control. In addition the network's Focal Point and partners were honored, and ceremony ended with a group picture.

Y PEER Libya, in partnership with the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) Libya, has participated in the training of trainers for the first time in Libya (Training of trainers on civic engagement for social change) Which included the process for youth active participation for achieving rights-based social change, the discussed items were

- 1. Fundamental concepts of social change, civic engagement and human rights.
- 2. The social relationships dynamic which based on distribution of power as well as the role of representatives and institutions in guarantee of rights
- 3 Enable participants to understand the tools of analysis, action and evaluation.

12 young people 4 girls 8 boys from 9 different municipalities participated in the training, and included the cities of East, West and South. This training took place in Hammamet, Tunisia, and lasted for 6 continuous days.

Participants in this training have acquired the basic skills to training which will convey to their peers by conducting the same training in mid2018- as planned.







Since the formation of Y-PEER in Nepal on December 2010, it has been working to build the capacity of young peer educators and mobilize them in their community, to educate larger group of young people on issues concerning Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH). At present , 180 Peer Educators (PE) and Certified Trainers have been trained during four National Trainings of Trainers (TOT) in Peer Education and one Training on Project Proposal Development and Result Based Management in 35 districts. These PEs represent their own respective organization in the training and they gain skills in using various tools, techniques and methodologies of peer education which they incorporate in their existing work, especially through orientation classes in schools, colleges, youth clubs and youth information centers.

1 Peer 1 School

Y-PEER Nepal implemented the project "I peer I school" in Bajhang, Baitadi, Rukum, Sindhuli, Udaypur and Sunsari districts from February 2017 to September 2017. Jointly implemented by Restless Development and UNFPA, the objective of the I Peer I School project was to enhance the knowledge of and deliver basic and accurate information on SRHR, CSE and SDGs, among adolescents in school, using the peer to peer approach. Likewise, this project aimed to motivate the peer educators by certifying them as trainers for the project.

Training sessions focused on capacitating the 12 peer educators from 6 different districts on the manual prepared for 1 Peer 1 School. Y-PEER Nepal conducted the three-day refresher training with support from UNFPA and Restless Development from February 28 to March 2017,1 in Nagarkot, Bhaktapur.

Campaign for engaging and promoting meaningful youth participation against early marriage and child marriage

Y-PEER Nepal's Kathmandu and Sunsari team conducted two different series of campaigns for engaging and promoting meaningful youth participation against early marriage and child marriage. Y-PEER Central team conducted an online campaign, as well as a talk session with youth representatives from different colleges.

#Menstruation matters campaign

On 28th May – the Menstrual Hygiene Day, Y-PEER Nepal's peer educators discussed with on menstruation and the importance of menstruation hygiene. An online campaign was conducted as well.



World Population Day

Y-PEER Sunsari team with support from UNFPA and in coordination with the District Coordination Committee organized an interaction program on "Family Planning: Empowering People, Developing Nations" to address World Population Day 2017.

Y-PEER NEPAL

Y-PEER Nepal conducted an online campaign against Gender Based Violence for 16 days, with the thoughts of 16 people from 16 different backgrounds.



Orientations, workshops, conferences

Y-PEER Nepal organized an orientation on GBV with the support of the National Women Commission, Care Nepal and The World Bank to youths of Kadambari Memorial College. They were encouraged to further disseminate their knowledge amongst society and create awareness of the NWC-Helpline on violence against women.

A -2day workshop on SRHR and SDGs with the support of Y-PEER Asia Pacific and UNFPA in collaboration with 2030 Youth Force in Nepal also took place.

Y-PEER Sunsari team, with the support of Y-PEER Asia Pacific and UNFPA organized a street theather on menstrual health in the rural communities and distributed sanitary napkins.

Y-Peer representatives participated in the Asia Pacific Training of Trainers on SRHR for Youth Advocates (16 – 12 December, Bangkok, Thailand), as well as in the Asia Pacific Conference on Reproductive Health Rights (30-27 November, Hanoi, Vietnam).



Started with a national united camp

on peace building gathering 197 young person Egyptian & Syrian, trainers & peer educators all together for 6 days, This camp had a variety of activities like: workshops, theater, team building activities, ceremony, social activities and more.

First campaign women empowerment

was about reducing gender based violence which include many topics like sexual harassment, domestic violence, etc also peace building and child marriage. The final statistics of the campaign:

World AIDS Day- 10 Days of Activism

10 Days of Activism Campaign of 2016 was carried out by 1st December Young Initiative which is led by Youth Approaches to Health Association (Y-PEER Turkey) with different partners and UNFPA Turkey. Take Care of Yourself Box Game is played, condom and material distribution, movie screenings, panels, workshops and 2-1 days trainings on sexual and reproductive health took place in 9 different cities of Turkey between 1st - 10th December. There were different activities including 22 peer training sessions and 515 hours of voluntary service. 2003 condoms were distributed. 309 young people were reached throughout the country.

Reproductive Health Peer Education Project

14th Peer Education for Trainers of Reproductive Health Peer Project was organized in 22-15 December in Istanbul and 24 young people have become peer trainers. Reproductive Health Peer Education Project aims to increase awareness of young people on sexual and reproductive health and rights and creating healthy behavior habits in youth and led by the partnership of Youth Approaches to Health Association, Community Volunteers Foundation and UNFPA Turkey. The project continues for 12 years and is the oldest project of Y-PEER Turkey. It creates basis and experience for Y-PEER Turkey to create new projects that have different target groups.



Support to Young Refugees Project

Support to Young Refugees Project is an empowerment project led by the partnership of Community Volunteers Foundation, Youth Approaches to Health Association (Y-PEER Turkey) and UNFPA Turkey. Project aims to empower and integrate 30-18 years old Syrian young refugees in Turkey. Project activities are taking place in youth centers in Hatay, Ankara and Diyarbakir.



2 Training of Peer Educators on Sexual and Reproductive Health in Humanitarian Settings took place on 16-11 September in Ankara. Menstruation calendars and informative handbooks are produced and distributed to centers in September. At total, 1997 young people were reached through peer training and 578 young people were reached through Take Care of Yourself Box Game (informative, educational board game).

New Youth Center is opened in Izmir within Support to Young Refugees Project on 13th December 2017. The center carries the name of Bulut Öncü who was one of the founders of Youth Approaches to Health Association and a fascinating youth, SRHR and human rights advocate, passed away in February 2017.

Youth Friendly Health Service Provision



Youth Friendly Health Service Provision aims to empower health service providers working in UNFPA centers in terms of youth friendly approaches and public assistance programs by organizing workshops. Besides these workshops, the project aims to empower Syrian youth to raise awareness on sexual and reproductive health and make them to empower their peers.

93 health service providers were reached by 4 Youth Friendly Health Services training. Youth Friendly Health Services Approach Guide has been prepared in both Turkish and Arabic and 1000 manuals were published. Training of Peer Educators on Sexual and Reproductive Health in Humanitarian Settings was conducted on 22-17 November in Izmir and 23 young people have become peer trainers. 76 young Syrian women and men were reached through dissemination activities.

Young LGBTI Sexual Health Project

Young LGBTI Sexual Health Project which funded by MATRA Human Rights Fund, is led by Youth Approaches to Health Association (Y-PEER Turkey) with technical support of UNFPA Country Office. Project aims to increase awareness of young LGBTI people on sexual and reproductive health and ensure their access to health and information services without discrimination and stigma.



55 representatives of public health, municipality, academy, professional organizations and non-governmental organizations participated in Local Advisory Meetings which were held in Mersin, Eskisehir, Istanbul. Young LGBTI people's access to sexual health services, its quality and the possible partnerships were discussed in the meetings.

238 young people were reached through peer trainings which were conducted in 6 cities.

The 15th International Dialogue on Population and Sustainable Development



The 15th International Dialogue on Population and Sustainable Development took place in Berlin in November, with delegates delivering a message of resilience in challenging political times, and the protection of the sexual and reproductive health and rights of young people, people living with disabilities and people living in fragile settings.

The two-day conference allowed for an exchange between stakeholders from governments, civil society organizations and multilateral institutions. Cansu Taşdemir who is the chair of Youth Approaches to Health Association, attend the conference from Y-PEER Turkey and presented the activities of Y-PEER Turkey and main projects of Youth Approaches to Health Association (Y-PEER Turkey). Y-PEER Turkey won The Award: Reaching Young Refugees.

Istanbul Marathon 2017, Take Care of Youth Race Campaign

Adım Adım Platform organizes charity races to create resources for various NGOs. On 12 November 2017, Youth Approaches to Health Association participated Istanbul Marathon with Adım Adım Platform as well with 32 runners. Runners were supported by 517 donators and collected almost 6000 \$. This amount will ensure 105 more young people to access sexual and reproductive health education.





July 2017 - December 2017

Peer Education Training Workshops:

Between July and December 2017, Y-PEER Iraq Network held 15 peereducation training workshops (3 to 5 days each) to introduce new and motivated members into the network and expand across several governorates in Iraq. Workshops were held in Baghdad, Anbar, Babylon, Diyala, Wasit, Salah al-din, Mosul, Maysan, Najaf, Erbil, Suleimanyah, and Duhok spanning the northern, southern and mid-region of the country. Over 250 new members were recruited and several new focal points were assigned to newly established teams. 8 of these workshops were held in less than 2 months and were immediately followed by activities carried out by newly recruited members with supervision from the network's coordination which ranged from education sessions to awareness campaigns in the participants' hometowns.



Educational Sessions:

77 educational sessions were held by peer educators in the different governorates and provinces of Iraq: Wasit (6), Erbil (7), Salah al-Din (7), Duhok (9), Mosul (6), Diyala (6), Anbar (5), Maysan (2), Diwanya (3), Suleimanya (5), Baghdad (3), Muthana (3), Babylon (1), and Najaf (1). These were held in universities, high schools, youth centers and in outdoor amusement parks. A big number of these sessions targeted vulnerable groups and displaced youth and many were held in IDP and refugee camps. 16 of those sessions were held as part of a project by



the International Organization for Migration in Iraq where participants were a combination of displaced youth and host community in the framework of strengthening social cohesion in Baghdad. The topics included youth participation, gender equality, reproductive health and rights, discrimination, addiction, healthy lifestyle, and many other topics that the network's members find important to discuss with the youth and spread awareness about.

August and the Iraq We Want Campaign

In August 2017, in celebration of the International Youth Day and the newly-appointed UN Youth Envoy's first mission and visit after assuming her role, Y-Peer Iraq held a number of activities. These included bringing in 10 active members from across the country, including the national coordinators, to meet the Envoy in Baghdad in a thorough discussion she requested with active Iraqi youth. The challenges that young activists meet were communicated with the Special Envoy and the overall status quo of young people in Iraq was elaborately discussed.

number of recommendations were made as well. Y-Peer also participated in a youth conference and event in the National Iraqi Theatre attended by UN delegates, namely including the Envoy herself, the representative of UNAMI, and the head of UNFPA. The network also held celebratory sessions in IDP camps for adolescent and young displaced women and girls as part of the UNFPA program in camps in celebration of the International Youth Day. Young Y-Peerians also held a peer education session in which the envoy herself participated and gave overwhelmingly positive feedback. A -3day peer education training workshop was held in Maysan to coincide with the activities and another two in Baghdad and one in Babylon. Lastly, a mixed-gender football match was held to send a message on female participation in sports parallel to males – a taboo in Iraq's conservative community. These activities were labelled The Iraq We Want Campaign and all were designed to serve to advertise an image of the "kind of Iraq" we, as peaceful and active young citizens, want to live in.




10 Days of Activism:

Having topped the activity chart internationally in the 10 Days of Activism, Y-Peer Iraq had big shoes to fill this year and a strong commitment to excel in spreading the Y-Peer message among young men and women all over the country every day of those 10 days. Peer educators around Iraq held 30 peer education sessions – bringing up the total number of sessions conducted in the second half of 2017 to over 100 – in the governorates of Wasit (8), Duhok (2),



Babylon (1), Mosul (5), Diywania (3), Diyala (2), Baghdad (5), Suleimanya (2), and Karbala (1). In addition, the team took its activity to social media sharing inspirational stories on Y-Peer members and videos on internet addiction and smoking to spread the values of the network to almost 30,000 people who follow its Facebook page. In addition, the team in Suleimanya held a field event where they donated 250 books under the







10 Days of Activism:

In Maysan and Babylon, the teams held booths where they interacted with passers-by in busy places in their respective governorates spreading some of Y-Peer's messages and campaigning for the network. Lastly, a -3day exchange camp with a packed schedule of peer education interactive sessions and activities was held in Duhok with young participants from the Kurdistan region of Iraq.





Other Activities:

Y-Peer Iraq frequently takes part in carnivals and festivals and carries on field awareness campaigns in public areas. In the second half of 2017, the network participated in a peace carnival in Anbar, "I Love Maysan" carnival in Maysan, the 16 Days of Activism campaign to counter gender-based violence and empower women and girls, and in coordinating the concert held by world famous Iraqi musician Nassir Shama, titled "Together for Peace".





Other Activities:

". In Duhok, the network also held a capacity building workshop for youth NGOs in Duhok organized by the UNFPA, Y-Peer's long-time partner in Iraq. In Suleimanya, a two-day workshop was held in July on "Non-Violence Techniques" in partnership with Iraqi Social Forum and Fai Organization.









World Population Day - 11 July 2017

On 11 th July Y-PEER Albania, in collaboration with "Act For Society", organized a one-day training with Roma Community representatives

in Pogradec City. It concerned family planning and contraceptive methods.

Sexual Reproductive health Workshop at Sami Frasheri High School and Qemal **Stafa High School:**

On 26 September and 9 October Y-PEER Albania, with the support of UNFPA Albania and the coordination of the Observatory for the Children's Rights, on the occasion of the World Contraception Day, conducted a workshop on the topic "Youth and Contraception". It was animated by 3 ToT-trained Y-PEER

members. Representatives from the Public Health Institution were also invited, in order to have a comprehensive discussion.

The workshop was focused on SRH, and more specifically, on contraception, physiology and anatomy of the reproductive system, sexual and reproductive rights. The students wrote their questions or concerns on small pieces of paper and handed them anonymously. At the end of the workshop, the trainers answered and gave additional information.

Info sessions and discussion about healthy lifestyle of the adolescent:

On 8th and 15th October Y-PEER Albania conducted 4 meetings with young people in Kamza City. The main target group were highschool students, unschooled people and young people from different marginalized communities in the area. Health issues and common adolescent nocive behavoir were discussed, and in particular mental health, nutrition, physical activity, SRHR, as well as HIV/AIDS.



Workshop Model on Peer to Peer Education

As a part of the 10 Days of Activism Campaign, Y-PEER Albania, in collaboration with members of the Youth Voice Network and with the coordination of the Observatory for the Children's Rights and the support of UNFPA Albania, conducted two workshop model s on peer-to-peer education based on the Y-PEER standardized curricula. Workshops took place in Tirana and in the city of Cerrik.

These served to promote the Y-PEER network among young people and encourage them to advocate for SRHR issues. The workshops were successful and contributed indirectly to the 10 Days of Activism event, as participants developed and conducted awareness campaigns on HIV /AIDS afterwards One of the young people who learned about it said "I am a little surprised because I never thought that in our city, which is so conservative, there would be activities on

this topic".

Visit to the Albanian Parliament

30 Y-PEER volunteers visited the Albanian Parliament on 14 December. The main goal of this activity was to promote the participation of young people in decision-making and policy-making. The participants attended the parliamentary session, in order to understand how the parliament functions. Parliament staff members provided information on the system of participating of the citizens in decision-making. Most of the participants in this activity were young people from Northern Albania, where a significant lack of youth services and activities is endured.



Thus, this activity seeked to encourage young people to be more active and to increase their human capital.

One-day campaign for raising awareness about HIV/AIDS in Tirana City

As part of the 10 DoA Campaign, Y-PEER Albania organized a one-day campaign for raising awareness on HIV/AIDS issues, such as stigma and discrimination, on 14th December. This campaign was organized by our peer educators from the Roma and Egyptian communities. Other informative sessions took place in Elbasan, Kamez, Shkoder, Puke, Shkoze, all in collaboration with different partners like Act for Society, Youth Council of the High School, Youth Club "Petro Nini". About 20 peer educators were involved in these info sessions.



Y-PEER celebration "PEERfect Reunion 2017"

For the second year in a row, Y-PEER Albania organized a big celebration for New Year's Eve, in order to thank all the collaborators, supporters and all the members engaged in 2017. There were games, music, a space for socializing and networking.

7 day Training "Human Rights and Peer Education Academy"



For the second year in a row, Y-PEER Albania, in collaboration with Albania Human Rights Group, gathered together 25 young people from all over Albania in Voskopoja. The participants were 24-17 years old, coming from different communities and minorities in Albania, such as the Roma and Egyptian community, the Bulgarian and Greek minorities. The main topic was the concept of the human rights, especially sexual and reproductive rights. Pr. Theodor Orlins, an international lector on Human Rights, served as a trainer. Some information on the parliament system in Albania and the ways to monitor its work and address youth issues was also provided.

As a part of the agenda two important meeting took place. One with Mrs. Elona Gjebra who is a new member of our parliament and is one of the biggest supporters of Y-PEER, as well as a long discussion on youth issues with deputies from the Korca Region.





International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women

On the occasion of the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, on 25th November, Y-PEER Albania, in collaboration with the Center "Act for Society", conducted a social experiment in Tirana. A female mannequin was placed with different messages against violence attached. The objective was to raise awareness the fact that violence can affect every woman, despite their outfit and appearance.

YMCA Tirana/Albania, in collaboration with Y-PEER organised the activity on the occasion of the International Adolescente Girl Day. The aim of this activity was to raise awareness among young people on the importance of reducing adolescence pregnancies, ending child marriage. It was centered on involving the youth in the initiatives related to health protection.





Three Days of Peace Activism Campaign

Y-PEER Syria participated in the Joint Regional Campaign on Promoting the Culture of Peace through Advocating for Gender Equality and Reducing Gender Based Violence.

Specific Objectives:

- 1. Mobilize and raise awareness of young people on gender equality.
- 2. Promote the culture of peace as a mean to reduce GBV.
- 3. Build the capacity of young people through their participation in out-reach and media activities.
- 4. Strengthen Y-PEER partnership with other national, regional and international organizations that advocate for peace, gender equality and reducing GBV. **Implementation:**

1st day (July 11): • Social Media Campaign on GBV, Gender Equality, and young people role topics: Y-PEER SYRIA launched the campaign on the social media website Facebook, the campaign contained a series of awareness messages aimed to promote the peace culture throughout advocating gender equality and decreasing gender-based violence.

2nd day (July 12):

Location: Reda Saeed hall – Damascus University Round table group discussion about GBV and Gender Equality (11:00 a.m. - 16:00 p.m.): Invitations were sent to a number of organizations, community initiative, associations and voluntary teams to participate in a round table group discussion about the youth role in advocating gender equality and decreasing gender-based violence in order to promote peace culture.



The day started by welcoming the participants and introducing Y-PEER SYRIA and the "Three Days of Peace Activism Campaign". The group discussion consisted of two groups on two round tables, each one had a representative of each participant party. The first group held the (Gender Equality) topic the second one held the (GBV). The discussion consisted of a series of points and questions

- ☑ How the participating parties are working and implementing those two topics
- ☑ How the young people effectively participate in reaching these goals?
- A presentation on what was shared before to the other table and the invitees.
- ☑ Recommendations for future coordination mechanisms.

In the end, the goals of this activity:

- Raising the youth awareness about gender equality and gender-based violence.
- Promoting their participation in social activities.
- Introducing them to each other and their community work.

• Building a network between them. Were successfully achieved.

☑ Graffiti Paintings Exhibition (16:00 p.m. - 17:00 p.m.) The exhibition contained graffiti paintings painted by young people and related to the campaign topics.

The artists introduced their works to the public visitors, and explained the messages that they are trying to deliver through the paintings, the event was covered by multiple T.V channels and reported by the Syrian Arab News Agency. The art gallery was attended by around 125 young visitors. The day was settled with four different interactive theater sketches implemented by young Y-PEERians, the sketches' topics was about youth issues and the campaign's topics: • Young people problems interring the market and gender prejudice. • Early marriage. • Gender-based violence. • Youth problems and society pressures.

At the end of each sketch, the Y-PEERian facilitator started an open discussion with the audience to set a number of implementable solutions

3rd day (July 13):

⊠ Forum (11:00 a.m. - 16:00 p.m.): Each of the participated Society teams, associations, initiatives, and organizations gathered in the forum to share information about their work, vices they provide, and how to join to their teams to the other parties. In the end, they agreed on working to build a network between them.









☐ Graffiti Paintings Exhibition (16:00 p.m. - 17:00 p.m.) The art gallery reopened, and was attended by around 140 young visitors.

Musical Concert (17:00 p.m. – 19:00 p.m.): At the end of the campaign, Shalabia band entertained the audience with a musical performance and the event was concluded by thanking all of the participants, artists and the organizing team.

Peer Education (Damascus)

25 Syrian young persons from several national NGOs, associations, and initiatives had the chance to participate in the 4 Days of Peer Education in Humanitarian Settings Trainings in Damascus, the training included sessions on: • Peer education. • Sustainable Development Goals. • Sexually Transmitted Diseases. • Gender Vs. Sex • Drugs. • Most vulnerable people. • Stigma and discrimination. • Introduction to peace building. • Leadership. • Interactive theatre technique.

The training methods used in sessions were: Group work, role play, brain storming, games, open discussions and case studies.





Theater-Based Peer Education (Qamishli & Ra'as El Ein)

25 trainees from the north Syrian cities "Hasakeh" & "Qamishli" volunteers in two associations (El Bir from "Ra'as El Ein", El Bir & Social Services "Hasakeh") were trained for six days in Damascus on using interactive theater techniques to discuss young social problems and issues like "early Marriage, Domestic violence, harassment, drugs and other topics". By the end of the training, the trainees conducted interactive theater sketches, made in event and invited the community.

Theater-Baser Peer Education

25 Syrian young persons from several national NGOs, associations, and initiatives were trained for six days in Damascus on using interactive theater techniques to discuss young social problems and issues like "early Marriage, Domestic violence, harassment, drugs and other topics".

Theater-Based Peer Education (Aleppo)

25 Syrian young persons from the Syrian Family Planning Association – Aleppo branch were trained for six days in Damascus on using interactive theater techniques to discuss young social problems and issues like "early Marriage, Domestic violence, harassment, drugs and other topics".

Interactive Theater Festival

12 teams presented their performances addressing topics related to reproductive health, gender-based violence, including discrimination and early marriage, drugs, and HIV/AIDS in front of 300 young girls and boys from 6 different Syrian governates Damascus, Rural Damascus, Sweida, Tartous, Hama (Mesyaf), and Aleppo.






Y-PEER Syria network celebrated the launch of the first Interactive Theater Festival in in Al Qabbani theater in Damascus on 14-13 December. The aim of the festival was to pave the way to a healthy environment where young people can develop their art skills to enable them to express themselves and address their communities' issues through interactive-based theatre

Peer Education Training of Trainers – PEToT

25 new Peer Educators from Damascus, Rural Damascus, Homs, Tartous, Hama (Misyaf) received an intensive training of trainers in Yafour, Rural Damascus on 30-25 December. The training helped empower the young participants and develop their skills by focusing on teamwork, communication skills, and other interpersonal development skills.





Y-PEER Belarus aims to make young people aware of the possibilities they have, enable them to conduct Y-PEER Belarus-related trainings and help them in writing their own modules and conducting trainings. Its activities emphasize the importance of the capacity of making responsible choices and of staying healthy and happy. Y-PEER facilitates the communication between young people and the government, as well as with other NGOs in order to make their work more efficient





Y-PEER Belarus conducted various events in 2017. In June and July, the International Organization for Migration managed trainings concerning gender, contraception and HIV prevention issues in a summer camp. The National Forum of Youth Organizations, which was held in August, also served as a training session on gender and gender-based violence.

Y-PEER Belarus

On the 9th September an "Innovation day" was co-hosted with UNFPA. A creativity platform for developing ideas on sexual and reproductive











The sexual and reproductive health and rights of people with disabilities was brought into focus on a lecture and discussion held in September.

At the end of the year, various trainings were organized, and in particular a National training for trainers in advocacy and media concerning SRHR, as well as basic national trainings for trainers, three trainings on HIV transmission and prevention in the National Model Agency, and trainings on youth participation in HIV prevention and Y-PEER opportunities in the State Palace of Youth and a State Music College.



After a long absence, Y-PEER Lebanon is back on the scene with great momentum, enthusiasm and dedication.

The Network commenced its activities in November by conducting a peer-education session on early marriage at a local educational institution. Y-PEER is actively recruiting new members and succeeded in recruiting enough members in 3 regions in Lebanon to be effective on a national scale: in Beirut (the capital), Saida (southern Lebanon), and Bekaa.

WORLD AIDS DAY

An awareness campaign on HIV was conducted in Saida and Baalbeck for 2 days in collaboration with the Salama association, and the Saida and the Baalbeck municipalities.

Our members reached out to the community to spread messages concerning HIV prevention and treatments. Their mottos were: "HIV is treatable" and "Avoid the scare, be aware."



Y-PEER Lebanon

International Volunteer Day

Y-PEER Lebanon members celebrated International Volunteer Day in Saida in collaboration with the Abnaa Saida association through promoting the Y-PEER network and the importance of volunteering for young people, as well as its impact on the health and well-being of communities worldwide.





Peer Education sessions

The Y-PEER members conducted consecutive peer education sessions in Bekaa at the Salama clinic and shed light on important Sexual and Reproductive Health subjects such as Violence, Sexual Assault, Gender and Sexuality, etc..

Y-PEER Lebanon network in a refugee camp

The Y-PEER members chose to establish their presence where it is most needed. More particularly, they conducted a highly interactive and successful peer-education session on early marriage to a group of adolescents aged between 13 to 16 in the Alwan centre at Ein El Helwe, a camp for Palestinian refugees in Lebanon.





The second half of 2017 had been fruitful for Y-PEER Kazakhstan. We did various advanced peer education training on youth issues and actively participated in different seminars, conferences and workshops related to young people during July and December 2017.

In honor of World Population Day, Youth Peer Education Network Y-PEER Kazakhstan with the support of the United Nations Information office in Kazakhstan and the United Nations Population Fund held a screening of the film "Love, Rosie" at the UN House in Almaty. Students from different universities and cities were acquainted with the activities of the Department of Public Information of the UN in Kazakhstan, the UN Refugee Agency, UN Women and Y-PEER in Kazakhstan.

Furthermore, in honor of this day, Volunteers of Y-PEER Kazakhstan in Shymkent city held an Action called "Plan Your Family, Plan Your Future" in Abay Park in Shymkent. The aim of the event was to draw public attention to the problems of population in the field of family planning through interactive games/competitions, including "drawings on asphalt" and Dance for life.



Moreover, on the theme "Family Planning" volunteers of Y-PEER Kazakhstan in Aktau city together with the Public Fund for Support and Development of Children, Youth and Family Programs "Urpak-Next" conducted an incendiary flash-mob and exciting interactive games in Aktau city.

Y-PEER Kazakhstan actively participated in Youth Day Forum which was organized by UN Office in Kazakhstan with the support of the UN Volunteers Program in the framework of the International "Future Energy Forum 2017" at EXPO 2017 Astana. The theme of the Youth Day Forum 2017 was devoted to the participation of young people in the transfer of knowledge and innovative approaches to sustainable development, energy-efficient lifestyles and reducing CO2 emissions to ensure peace and stability around the world.





The event took place in the format of a forum-coffee, which created an interactive platform for an open dialogue between active youth and various interested organizations (international development partners, government bodies, educational institutions, civil society, etc.). Participants got acquainted with the activities of youth peer education network and activities of UNFPA in Kazakhstan.

On August 2017, Y-PEER Kazakhstan together with the NGO "Doctar" organized Annual Summer School of Leadership in Shymkent city. Five unforgettable days were full of productive and funs! Participants from the different regions of South Kazakhstan Region had hot discussions on HLS, the prevention of HIV/AIDS, discrimination and violence against women, find the ways to prevent it, and etc.

Y-PEER Kazakhstan in Semey city, held an Action-campaign to mark the Day of Suicide Combat. The aim of the action was to instill in young people love for themselves, to feel love, to reduce the number of self-employed factors.

Y-PEER Kazakhstan members took an active part in international seminar on "The role of soft power and public diplomacy in the youth dialogue" and informed participants about international youth peer education network, SRHR, HIV/AIDS, Family planning, peer education and youth networking, actions & programs, which was held in Shymkent city. In this seminar participated about 20 representatives from different countries, as well as active young people from Kazakhstan. The main objective of this seminar was to create an informal environment for the benefit of the younger diplomats, the protection of international solidarity





In October 2017, a seminar was held on "Education of the girls - education of the Nation" at Kazakh National University named after Al-Farabi in Almaty. Within the framework of this event, the speakers stressed the importance of sexual education and upbringing of the youth. Also, speakers talked about the issues of Kazakhstan's suicide statistics among women, the importance of support services, women's rights and tolerance.

The girl-participants of the seminar were also trained by the members of Y-PEER Kazakhstan and are informed about sexual and reproductive health and rights, family planning, peer education and learned the basic information about the youth peer education network and were able to participate in the interactive game



In October 2017, the project named "Find your way" was held in Almaty within the framework of the project "I-SEED: Innovations - social entrepreneurship and education" of the British Council with the support of "Chevron" Company. The schoolchildren were given the opportunity to learn all about the popular professions from the employees of the best companies of Kazakhstan, youth organizations, education and grants. Our volunteers spoke with courtesy about the activities of Y-PEER Kazakhstan, and also conducted training about Team Building & peer education.

In November 2017, campaign-training was organized on the topic of "Young People & Life's spring" for pupils of the 8th grade of the "Pushkin" Gymnasium-School in Shymkent. Participants were amazed and impressed by the stories of the guys about their acquaintances who at one time could not say "NO" to nicotine, alcohol and even drugs; about those who entered into early sexual relations "out of interest" and how their fates were formed. Likewise, Y-PEER members in Aktau city have organized three different trainings on leadership, SRHR and HIV/AIDS prevention. Participants have been informed about sexual and reproductive health and encouraged to improve their leadership skills and learn more about youth and young people issues. Also, in the honor of World AIDS Day, Y-PEER Kazakhstan volunteers in Aktau city held an action-training on HIV/AIDS prevention. The purpose of the training was to explicitly reveal how HIV/AIDS can be infected and further information about its prevention.

In the framework of 10 Days of Activism, Y-PEER Kazakhstan did different advanced peer education trainings on SHRH, youth health, community participation and youth issues such as training on SHRH at Women's Pedagogical University in Almaty, playing basketball by Aktau team, screening a social video on the topic of "No stigma. No discrimination. No AIDS" by Shymkent volunteers, celebrating of International volunteer Day by Y-PEER Volunteers in Aktau city and etc.

According to Development Program of Y-PEER Kazakhstan and 10 Days of Activism, from 6 to 8 December 2017 lunched ToT (training for trainers) in Aktobe, Kazakhstan funded by UNFPA Kazakhstan. The best volunteers of the city took an active part; in the process of which they were educated about such topics as SRHR, STI, leadership, team-working, and gender equality. Games, energy buffer, brainstorming and, of course, the information itself was an integral part of the skills that will help them in further life and life! On the second day, the children received reliable information about gender equality, SRHR and STI.

Y-PEER Kazakhstan has presented by Yasir Rashid, FPC, in regional consultation "SDGs for Young People, Young People for SDGs: tracking progress in achieving youth-related SDGs and ICPD goals in Europe and Central Asia". Our FPC presented actively his Kazakhstani youth peers to discuss about youth problems and challenges in this region. In Sofia Meeting, Experts and Youth leaders from across Europe and Central Asia have gathered in Sofia for a three-day meeting on developing a regional monitoring system to track progress on youth-related goals and targets included in Agenda 2030 and the Program of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development.





Every year Y-Peer Bosnia and Herzegovina organizes a meeting with volunteers where they opportunity to present activities done in the previous period, but also create plan of action for future. On this meeting they are electing a new Focal point in charge. Jasmin Nikšić was elected for the new Focal point in Charge for the period 2018-2017.

Advocacy Campaign "My health does not have a deadline"

In collaboration with "Partnership in Health", CCI and ICVA advocacy campaign "My health does not have a deadline" is established with the aim to advocate for human rights in case of health insurance.

It is a known that in most parts of our country people do not have right for free health insurance if they are not registered on the list of Department for unemployed persons.

During this campaign our volunteers were visiting numerous cities and made street events where people could sign a petition and directly ask for their rights. "My health does not have a deadline" campaign was held in more than 50 cities.



Education for Youth councils

OSCE Mission in Bosnia and Herzegovina organised education for Youth councils where Y-Peer Bosnia and Herzegovina representative also attended. Together with other Youth participants our representatives had opportunity to learn more about Youth strategies, Youth council work. The main topic of this 2 day long training was "How to fight radicalisation and extremism?"



Online Quiz on RH and STD

One of our volunteers created online Quiz on Reproductive health and Sexually transmitted diseases which was shared online with young people. Quiz has basic question on how to protect your-self, how to prevent sexually transmitted dis-eases, what is the most important to know when it comes to reproductive healt.

Young people had opportunity also to learn a lot by answering and filling this Quiz.



Humanitarian Half Marathon

One of our volunteers participated at the Humanitarian Half Marathon in Sarajevo.

Half Marathon was organised in Sarajevo where a lot of people especially young people took their participation.

Half Marathon was organised to spread humanity, healthy living and awareness, but also to collect money for sick peers. Money was collected by paying kilometers that participants passed. Each kliometer of our volunteer was 2,00 BAM.

First Aid Competition

First Aid competition was organised by the Red Cross Ilidža, local branch of Sarajevo where 12 schools teams participated. They had to do different scenarios such as earthquake, car acident, fire, explosion, accident in schools. This was a great opportunity to promote health and importance of first aid skills.

Our volunteers also took a part on one of the fun stations where all teams had educational lessons. We had a chance to give them basic knowledge through the worshop on Reproductive health.





New series of workshops for young people: sustainable development goals and gender transformation programs

In July, the second and third part of new series of workshops on "Strengthening youth peer programming including gender transformative programming" were organized by the youth network Y-PEER Macedonia in Skopje.

Representatives of 11 youth organizations discussed ways to harmonize and align their activities, particularly in order to strengthen their capacities for planning and implementing peer education, the new UN 2030 development agenda, sustainable development goals (SDGs) and gender equality.

The representatives had the opportunity to discuss youth participation in decision making processes at all levels.

Young people were introduced to the worldwide and national processes related to the goals for sustainable development. They got to know what the young people are doing on a global level in the direction of creating a better world in which no one is left behind. Representatives of the Y-PEER Macedonia team presented youth participation in different processes related to SDGs and 2030 Agenda implementation in Macedonia. As a conclusion to the first workshop, it has emerged that more needs to be done in the direction of articulating youth voices and youth needs related to the new development agenda.

Regarding gender equality, the third workshop presented the approach of gender transform programming to its participants who acquired knowledge and theoretical information, and discussed upcoming activities of the MenEngage campaign in Macedonia. The discussion reflected with a conclusion underlining the necessity to work more towards the inclusion of everyone, with emphasis in involving men in gender

equality advocacy.



Youth Workshop "Increasing youth participation in decision-making processes and cooperation with institutions"

In September, Y-PEER Macedonia organized a workshop entitled "Increasing the youth participation in the processes of decision-making and cooperation with institutions". The event which was held in Skopje was attended by 17 young people - representatives from organizations working with youth in Macedonia: ARNO, Forum 16, YES Macedonia, CID, "HERA", "The youth can", AEZH, Red Cross - M. Brod, KRIK, AIESEC. This event, gave young people the opportunity to get informed about the ongoing processes within the United Nations Development Agenda and the Youth participation agenda. Ms. Sanja Zografska Krsteska - representative of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Macedonia, served as a guest speaker at the workshop. Ms. Zoografska Krsteska presented the process by pointing out that "... the goals are formulated to address all problems in societies on a global scale. Through them all, one thread horizontally, the need to respect human rights and the rule of law."

During the presentation, emphasis was placed on the partnerships and the role of young people in development processes.

"Goal 17 is designed for global partnerships. Young people are the main target group along with women who go through all CSRs and here is your opportunity to get involved, first at the local level in your communities, then nationally. Young people are factors that influence change and help in the implementation of goals. "- noted Ms. Zoografska Krsteska.

Through the Q&A session young participants got informed on the processes at a higher level, and got acquainted with the main steps taken by countries around the world for the process related to UN 2030 Agenda.

Conference "Youth, Peace and Security"

In October Y-PEER Macedonia organized the first conference on "Youth, Peace and Security". The conference was attended by 20 young people from different cities in Macedonia who had the opportunity to learn about the concepts of peace, the new development agenda of the United Nations and the goals for sustainable development (SDGs).

The conference aimed to improve the capacities of young people, to gain knowledge about the approaches to building peace through initiatives of youth organizations, involving marginalized adolescents and young people. The participants had the opportunity to acquire skills and knowledge on how to implement peace-building initiatives through their active involvement in various processes that contribute to security and stability in social integration processes.

The conference was opened by the Minister of Defense Ms. Radmila Shekerinska with a warm address:

"The state can be resistant to security risks only if the rule of law is respected, and if it has state institutions that function fairly, free media and justice! There is no stability if there is no democracy. Macedonia is in a position to show that by strengthening democracy and the rule of law, security is strengthened, that ethnic and religious diversity does not mean risk. Let's transform the crisis into an opportunity to become an example! Be more active, get involved in the decision making process, use public pressure to defend your rights, engage young people who feel isolated, be active! It is very important to get engaged, to be loud, to know what want."

Youth were welcomed by Ms. Jovanka Brajovic Grigorijevic, a representative of the UNFPA Country Office: "Young people today face many problems and challenges, but if they have the right opportunities, they can be the real drivers of change towards achieving a more inclusive society, in which everyone lives in prosperity."

The Focal Point in Charge of Y-PEER Macedonia, Mr. Kristijan Angeleski, also addressed the participants:

"Today and tomorrow we are here with the youth to work on this very important topic. Young people in 2015 received the 2250 Resolution on youth, peace and security that highlights the role of governments in protecting young people in times of conflict and within post-conflict societies, promoting their role in building and preserving peace, including youth participation at all levels of decision-making. This resolution calls the UN member states to offer mechanisms for conflict prevention and resolution, in partnership with young people. The next steps of Y-PEER Macedonia are related to the further advocacy and engagement of young people and their participation in the national processes and the localization of the Sustainable Development Goals in a national context. Co-operation with institutions is crucial in these







Youth workshop: "THE GENDER PERSPECTIVE ON THE ISSUES OF SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH"

Y-PEER Macedonia, supported by UNFPA CO in Skopje, organized a two-day workshop in Skopje, entitled "The gender perspective on the issues of sexual and reproductive health". 17 young people from different youth-focused associations (KRIK, Youth Can, Red Cross, Gender Perspective, HERA, ARNO, Volunteer Center - Skopje and Humanity) participated.

Through this workshop, young people had the opportunity to expand their knowledge and capacities in the field of "Gender" and the integration of the gender component in global and national processes.

Guest speakers included the United Nations Resident Coordinator in Macedonia, Ms. Louisa Vinton, Irena Cvetkovic form the Sexual and Health Rights of Marginalized Communities Coalition, Ljupka Trajanovska (National Network to End Violence against Women and Domestic Violence "Voice against Violence"), and Irina Janevska (Association for Social Innovations "ARNO"). The youth had the opportunity to discuss the gender component, expand their knowledge on the subject and get informed about the ongoing processes within the United Nations Development Agenda related to gender equality, the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the inclusion opportunities of young people.

The United Nations Resident Coordinator in Macedonia, Ms. Louisa Vinton, gave a brief overview of the global processes and localization of the 2030 Agenda in Macedonia, pointing out that "..the goals are universal, which means that they apply to all people in the world and are connected in one common system. The challenge that we are facing is really demanding and our task is to make every effort to fulfill them."

"For the United Nations, young people are not just a target group. They are also our partners. Young people are aware of new information technologies. They have the skills and knowledge to create together optimal solutions that could help us in the implementation."- said Ms. Vinton.

During the workshop, and particularly during the questions and answers session, young people had the opportunity to discuss the global processes related to SDGs, the implementation on a global and local level, as well as the integration of the gender component within the national framework related to implementation of the 2030 agenda in Macedonia.





Comprehensive Sexuality Education (CSE)

In September, Y-PEER Macedonia initiated the process for development of situational analyses on establishing a comprehensive sexuality education in Macedonia.

In December, an open consultative meeting was organized. Representatives from youth organizations, institutions and ministries had the opportunity to attend the presentation and to get to know more about the situation regarding the establishment of the CSE in the region. The presentation was followed by a discussion where the representatives of the youth organizations and institutions shared their expertise and experience in the field of CSE topics, as well as the opportunities and challenges they had faced.

The analysis was finalized and published by the end of December.



MenEngage Campaign

In Macedonia the Organization for Social Innovations "ARNO", in partner-ship with Y-PEER Macedonia, and supported by the Regional Office of UNFPA for Eastern Europe and Central Asia implemented the campaign "Engaging Men and Boys for Gender Equality".

The campaign was focused on communicating with the community and the media, organizing trainings and events promoting development of men's skills in child-care and household care.

In October 2017, "The First Men's Fair" was organized. The Men's Fair comprised three different workshops: "Men Iron", "Men Cook" and "Creative games for kids".

As a part of the activities of the Y-PEER network Morocco, the members of the Network participated in the workshop organized by UNFPA at Agadir. The objective of the workshop was to reach near the motivation and commitment of its members to activate within the schools. As well, and with a view to institutionalize the collaboration between the network and the Ministry of National Education. The meeting aims two major objectives: the development of a book of specifications of the interventions of the members of the network in the schools: the roles, expectations, the tools and the means of work and the planning of future actions for the implantation of the kit with the collaboration of the network: including the 10 Days of Activism - DoA. We also plan our actions in collaboration with the senior managers of the Department of National Education.



Within the activities arranged monthly by Y-PEER Morocco, the latter has implemented four sessions of Peer Education and Life Skills at El Mohamadia School, Beni Mellal during the month of October, 2017. These processed activities that are still going on and will also take place very soon in different regions of Morocco are the outcome of two trainings from which around 30 teachers and 5 members of Y-PEER have benefited. This huge national event came to existence because of the intentional collaboration of UNFPA Morocco and the Ministry of National Education in view to enhance students' life skills as well as enabling them to transfer such capacities to their vulnerable peers.

These sessions in which 35 students have been participating addressed different issues related to youth and more importantly to teenagers. These serious issues include HIV/AIDS, smoking, drugs using and other psychological destructive drivers including depression, emptiness and peer pressure. That is why, the trainers tried their best to make them firstly aware of these immense issues and also well equipped with life skills to protect themselves and affect their peers positively.

Consequently, the training was largely turned around the importance of peer education and the roles of peer educators to raise awareness among other students, particularly that of sexual and reproductive health as well as the dangerous aftermaths of smoking and drugs using. On the other hand, trainers and participants have magnificently stressed on the fact that all these issues that destruct young people's lives are due to the socio-cultural taboos that society has encumbered its generations with.



Thus, at the end and exactly after students of El Mohamadia school in Beni mellal were introduced to the real definitions of sexual and reproductive health, it was clear to them that people have wrong definitions of sexual health, that is why it has been considered taboo or "hshouma". This reality that was made clear has given fruitful results in the session and made several recommendations clear as the fact that youth and adolescents should be introduced to the real definition of SRH to break the silence that society has constructed between parents and their children.

Y-PEER Morocco with the support of UNFPA Morocco and Ministry of National Education office has celebrated the 10DoA from November 01th to 10th December in 03 different cities around the kingdom of Morocco (South of Morocco). This campaign was marked by several activities and events, including: Organization of 03 Basic Training of Peers Educators.





December 2017,06. Y-Peer Morocco organized a Training session about the Peer Education and Sexual and Reproductive Health for young students in the School Sous Al Alima in the south of Morocco, aids was the main topic of these sessions since the region scored high prevalence of SIDS, And this referring to experts is due to lake of sexual education in Moroccan school, and taboo in society.

As part of the activities of the network Y-PEER Morocco and coordination with the Ministry of Education and UNFPA, basic training in peer education techniques, sexual and reproductive health and violence based on gender, was organized for the benefit of students in schools. We dug in the 10 Days of Activism on the high schools of the Sous Massa Regional Academy.





As a part of the activities of Y-PEER Morocco, 3 focal points of the Y-PEER Morocco network benefited from an interactive theater training organized by Rabéta Mohammedia des Oulémas in collaboration with UNFPA under the theme "the fight against violence against women".




Since the beginning of this year, we managed to conduct movie days to support raising awareness on gender, SRHR topics, such as HIV/AIDs and STIs in general. In December, Y-PEER Azerbaijan has co-hosted the last film screening for 2017, in cooperation with Azerbaijan Caspian Platform and the United Nations Population Fund Azerbaijan. The movie "Philadelphia" was projected in connection with the International AIDS Day.



After the film, discussion among participants on HIV/AIDS was held. The facilitators and participants talked about methods and stereotypic behaviors against people living with AIDS.

At the end of discussion informational brochures from UNFPA country office were distributed among participants of the movie screening. Around 20 participants took part in the discussion and movie screening.





Arta

Djibouti is a crossroad of migration and refugees passing through the country to seek their fortune in the Gulf countries or escape conflicts in their homeland.

Djibouti is known to contribute more and more to peacekeeping forces in several other countries. UNFPA Djibouti, in collaboration with the network of young peer educators Y-Peer Djibouti, has initiated education sessions for officer cadets at the Arta Military School to train them in the prevention of gender-based violence.

Attended by 50 cadets, these sessions also allowed discussions on the impact of risk behaviours that young people are experiencing and on sexual and reproductive health, particularly HIV/Aids prevention.

The Young cadets expressed the wish to intensify the partnership with UNFPA and Y-Peer Djibouti in order to extend it to all the military camps present in the country.

Meeting of the Regional Director of UNFPA and the members of the network of young peer educators Y-Peer Djibouti

During a working visit in Djibouti, the Regional Director met the young people of the Y-Peer network in Djibouti. They discussed the mandate of UNFPA, young people's needs and their expectations. Many young people expressed the desire to strengthen their efforts to their peers' behaviour.

The Regional Director committed to support them in their actions in favour of young people in Djibouti. He reaffirmed that young people are the future of a whole country and a whole nation and that UNFPA would put everything in place to accompany them as best as possible in their access to information, services adapted for young people, and access to training opportunities.





Peer Educators of the Georgian Youth Development and Education Association GYDEA organized informational sessions at Youth Summer Camp in Manavi (Kakheti) in July. These sessions aimed to inform young people of the importance and urgent issues such as HIV/AIDS, Reproductive Health and Rights and Gender issues.

GYDEA, with the partnership of the UNFPA Georgia and with the local association "Atinati" celebrated 12th August - the International Youth Day by conducting a -5day TOT training on Peer education.

As initiator of the peer education network in Georgia, GYDEA strives for raising awareness of the young generation on sensitive social topics, such as gender equality, gender based violence, sexual and reproductive health and rights, HIV/AIDS, etc. The training participants were selected based on the open call by the GYDEA. Attendees acquired relevant knowledge and skills to become the future trainers and educate their peers or the above mentioned issues.

It should be mentioned that the methods and activities used during our trainings and info sessions ensure participants' active engagement, and even though time is too limited to cover every burning issue in the field, info sessions are a good opportunity to encourage young people to start thinking about and discussing the above-mentioned topics.



Y-PEER Georgia

On 26th December, a round-table discussion was held at the Georgian Technical University on the topic of Youth Policy and Young People's access to the Comprehensive Sexuality Education in Georgia. The representatives of the various youth organizations joined to the discussion along with students.


This training was conducted in Afghan Family Guidance Association (AFGA) training hall for 3 days 25 youth both male and female were participated in this training.

Supporting the reform of the civil registration system in the Republic of Tajikistan

Within the framework of the project "Supporting the reform of the civil registration system in the Republic of Tajikistan", implemented jointly with the NGO "ANTI" since August, ToT on the theatre-based performances plus theatre-methodology of conveying messages has been conducted for the activists of the Rudaki district. The ToT has been conducted based on the "peer-to-peer" approach and defined standards. The key goal of the theatre-based performances to increase the level of awareness of the population on the problems of civil registration, the importance of timely registration of acts of civil status and obtaining a birth certificate of the newborn children. The project was executed by Y-PEER Tajikistan. Local implementation partners were the local executive body of the state power and the Youth and Sports sectors of the Rudaki district.

The created platform enabled sharpening and strengthening the skills of conducting trainings, focus groups, workshops, seminars and info sessions on reproductive health among young people.

An Annual meeting for developing the annual plan of action of 2018 and defining the priority areas for the network to focus on in 2018 was conducted.











In July 2017, Y-PEER Armenia had the opportunity to collaborate with UNDP and UNFPA Armenia. The projects we managed were mainly on SDGs and for the seek of their awareness and implementation. On the 20th of July, we started the sessions in the capital Yerevan. Around 50 participants gathered to discuss the SDGs and to get to know each other by creating networking. The important thing that we needed to tackle was keeping the touch with them plus including more youth organizations in the field. 

Congratulations to the new IC team and to the international network for the successful online election with wishes of a productive, efficient, motivated, youthful new term!


Anmar Khalid

 Young people and representatives of youth-led organizations, policy makers, statisticians, regional partners and UN agencies' representatives from across Europe and Central Asia gathered in Sofia for the three-day meeting on developing a regional monitoring system to track the progress on youth-related goals and targets included in Agenda 2030 and the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development. The main objectives of the meeting were to review the needs and challenges that young people in the region are facing, to identify the gaps in the SDG and ICPD indicators, related to these challenges and needs and the priorities in advancing youth agenda in the framework of ICPD and 2030 Agenda.
- •Following the example of the successful cooperation between NCPHA (PETRI-Sofia) and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Bulgaria which started in 2015, PETRI is implementing its third project funded by the Bulgarian Development Aid "Youth Leadership for the Development and Implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals". Through this project, the Institute continued its international fellowship program and will organize the Annual School on Project Development and Management and Fundraising and Resource Mobilization, as well as the General Advisory Board meeting of the Y-PEER Network in 2018.

- •PETRI-Sofia supported several international campaigns; among them are the **3 Days of Peace Activism Campaign** of Y-PEER, initiated by the ICYD Amman in July 2017, and the **Y-PEER 10 Days of Activism Campaign** 2017 on 10 1 December (you can read more about it on page ...).


Y-PEER Asia Pacific Center

ASIA PACIFIC TRAINING OF TRAINERS ON SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH AND RIGHTS FOR YOUTH ADVOCATES

16 - 12 December, 2017

Bangkok, Thailand

The training of trainers took place in Bangkok, Thailand with the support of UNFPA Cos, Y-Peer national networks, Youth-LEAD and other partners of IATT. Out of 800 applicants, 26 young people from different countries participated. The theme of the training was SRHS, sexuality and gender, HIV. It aimed to strengthen the skills of the youth advocates in promoting human rights concerning sex and sexuality amongst their peers and to provide space for them to learn, share their experience and network.

The first session concerned sex and gender seen through images and personal stories. The second session focused on sexual and reproductive health and gender. Discussions on human rights and the need to focus on marginalized groups were held. A participant drew attention to the fact that in some countries in the region, women don't have the right to make a decision concerning their own body, even if it means jeopardizing their own health. Others pointed out that in some regions, although abortions are legal since 2002, the stigma associated to it is still too strong due to cultural and religious reasons. The same goes for the free access to contraceptives. Early marriage still persists as a problem, with girls urged to marry by the age of 13 to 15 and already have several children at 18 years old.



The third session concerned sexuality – its definition, its cultural and legal aspects. It was pointed out that some countries, like Afghanistan and the Philippines, ban homosexuality. Many unwanted pregnancies occur due to poor SRH knowledge. At the same time, the law in Afghanistan bans abortion unless three different doctors study the case and conclude with unanimity that the pregnancy is dangerous for the woman's health. However there are many discrepancies in the Asia Pacific region, for example, abortion is very common in China – around 000 000 11 abortions take place every year. The opposite problem – a ban on having more children that the law allows exists there

ASIA PACIFIC TRAINING OF TRAINERS ON SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH AND RIGHTS FOR YOUTH ADVOCATES

16 - 12 December, 2017 Bangkok, Thailand

The fourth session discussed the different sex-related human rights, and in particular the right of life, of equality, health care and health protection, as well as the right of freedom of thought and the right of not being tortured, especially through exploitation, child prostitution, human trafficking, sexual abuse, bulling, rape.

Participants also received information on HIV/AIDS transmission and protection.

Post-training activities

One of the main objectives of the training was to enable the young participants to share their knowledge within their organization, institute and community and to disseminate SHRH information among their peers.

Finally, participants committed to staying in touch with the trainers for at least 12 months after the training and get involved in various online and on-field activities in the newly established network.


